

#### Creative Works provided over one million hours of direct care in 2022.



#### **INVESTING IN PARTICIPANTS**



Artist and retired employee of Maine Woodworks, Bill King, has completed sixteen oil portraits of participants at Creative Works. Featuring participants whose lives are rich with stories of happiness as well as hardships, Mr. King hopes to

present the collection in a public venue, showcasing issues of age, marriage, and family that affect those with disabilities. Portraits can be viewed at our administrative and community service locations.

#### **INVESTING IN STAFF**

Described by his supervisors as kind, caring and understanding, Direct Support Professional (DSP) Justin Dyer is advocating for Mainers who work as caregivers for those with disabilities. As a member of the State's Direct Care Council, Justin recently spoke at a conference for service providers, asking attendees to listen to their DSPs in an effort to attract, retain and empower this essential workforce. Justin is being featured in Governor Mills' *Caring for ME* initiative, aimed at attracting more Mainers into the career field. To his clients, Justin says, "It doesn't matter what your disability is... you can do anything."



#### **INVESTING IN OPERATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE**

The Maine State Legislature has honored the recommendations of multiple committees and increased the starting wage for direct care workers. Beginning January 1, 2022, the starting wage for DSPs is required to be 125% of minimum wage. A big thank you to our representatives and senators for recognizing how vital DSPs are to the wellness of the incredible people we serve, their families, and local communities throughout the state.

Maine Woodworks, our successful social enterprise, that employs and integrated workforce, introduced the new Farmhouse collection.
