INVESTING IN PARTICIPANTS

Since last July, the York/Cumberland Activities Committee has hosted dances, parties, BBQs and even a pig roast. Over 300 participants, staff and family members have attended an event this year. INVESTING IN STAFF

INVESTING IN OPERATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE

The Facilities team has joined forces with our administrative staff to beautify and upgrade our residences and community services locations. Starting last summer, we built a new, accessible patio for one of our Saco homes for adults with brain injuries, and also built raised flower beds for those with green thumbs at Five County Community Services. Most recently the team leveled an open lot and constructed an entire outdoor space at the Augusta Community Services location. Now that these spaces have been optimized, programs can utilize these spaces and enjoy some time outdoors!

INVESTING IN THE FUTURE

Creative Works has partnered with Best Buddies Maine to create a network of lasting friendships for our participants with intellectual disabilities. Together with employees of UNUM, and University of Southern Maine (USM) students, our program has grown to over 10 partnerships. We have participated in monthly activities such as open gym nights and corporate lunches. We've also grown to include participants with brain injuries, fundraising activities, and a team in the third annual Maine Best Buddies Walk. (Go Team Creative Works!) Our partnership with Best Buddies is poised to benefit participants for many years to come.







